

2014 Conference Set For Oceanside


The 2014 Annual Conference will be held September 8-11 at the Holiday Inn Marina, Oceanside, CA. The conference committee headed by LA Chapter President Bob Long has been working diligently to make the September event one of the best ever.

With the hotel situated very near the Camp Pendleton Main Gate events are being planned both on and off the base. Both the Monday Welcome Reception and the Thursday Sayonara Breakfast will be held at the hotel as will all Board Meetings and training activities scheduled for the active duty Marines. The traditional Merit Awards banquet will be held Wednesday evening aboard Camp Pendleton at the Pacific Views Event Center.

Bob's group has secured a great room rate of \$90 which is considered very reasonable for this area. The conference registration fee is set at \$75 and includes all three meal events and a round-trip train ride to San Diego's Old Town area.

Retired CC and Combat Camera Marine Charlie Ross died following a brief illness in Winter Park, FL on November 6. He was a veteran of both Korea and Vietnam, serving on a MoPic team in 1965-66. He was an active member of the Florida Chapter.



I am taking the liberty of re-printing here my letter to both the Association and Foundation Board of Directors so that all members have some idea of what has transpired regarding our USMCCCA Merit Awards Program.

We were told at our July conference last year by the Assistant Commandant, General John M. "Jay" Paxton, that changes were coming involving the Division of Public Affairs and, possibly, Combat Camera. The first of these came January 9 when DivPA more or less announced their new name: Office of Marine Corps Communication and Visual Information which, effectively unites **DivPA** and Combat Camera. More recently we were told that the official designation for DivPA will be: Office of United States Marine Corps Communication.

This information came associated with the 2013 Merit Awards Program, now to be known as the 2013 Office of Marine Corps Communication Visual Information and Excellence in Communications Awards, which will mirror the Thomas Jefferson Awards (DOD) program more than ever.

Major changes, other than the name, include a slight reduction and renaming of certain categories, limiting entrants to sergeants and below, and restricting entries (in most cases) to one in each category. Also, judging of entries will be the responsibility of independent judges selected by the Office of Marine Corps Communication (OMCC). The SOP is attached for your information. You will note the emphasis will now be on individual rather than unit awards.

Some may ask: Why should a program we started back in 1968 be taken over by HQMC? Board member **Manny Pacheco** has been our liaison to HQMC for the past year and has, what we think, is the best summation of the situation:

"We've all seen change coming ever since news of the Corps' draw down was made. With a reduction in force from 210,000 to a recently-announced 174,000 change was inevitable. As most of us have known, the previous Merit Award program had become too cumbersome by sheer volume and needed to be revised. While I may disagree with the way the program is being handled, I think we all need to try and understand that the entire Marine Corps is undergoing a tremendous period of change.

"From my conversations and observations with, and of, the current leadership, we need to look at 2014 as a year of transition, accept and support DivPA and look for opportunities to demonstrate our support as in the past. At this point, there is no reason

Happy New Year!

As you all know, our Foundation operates under 501.3(c) rules of the U.S. Tax Code that allow us to maintain a tax exempt filing status. One of the criteria used to gain our tax exempt status is the philanthropic work we do. For many years, the cornerstone of our tax exempt status has been the awarding of scholarships to members and their dependents.

Our scholarship programs began May 1, 1986, with an endowment from the family of Gladys McPartland, the long time Secretary of the USMCCCA at our New York office. These are awarded to those attending colleges or universities studying for degrees in any major.

Recently we have added a second scholarship award, the Gen. Robert L. Denig Memorial Scholarship, which is awarded only to applicants enrolled in majors leading to degrees in the communications arts and sciences.

Since 1986 we've continuously awarded scholarships each year (with a few exceptions in years when we received no applications). While this is an impressive record is, it is also somewhat misleading.

There has never been widespread financial support from our members for this program. In fact, the fund has been, at times, underwritten by contributions from other Foundation/Association accounts. In recent years, proceeds from the Florida Chapter's annual golf tournament has provided major support for the program. Simply stated, this haphazard approach cannot continue if the program is to remain viable.

As tuition and other academic fees have

increased several fold over the ensuing years, we have made only modest increases in our scholarship awards, increases that have surely not kept pace with inflation. In order to continue our scholarship program and to be in a position to offer larger awards we **MUST** increase member support for this vital program.

So I am issuing a challenge to all CCs to step up and make a special donation to the scholarship awards program in 2014. The amount you give should be a matter of conscience for each of you. While some are in a position to give more, we all can give something. No donation is too small, so give whatever you can.

To start the ball rolling, I am making a personal pledge of \$500 and I ask all of you to join me in pledging your support. Your donation need not be paid all at once. It can be made in quarterly amounts. You can also designate your Booster Club or Dedicated Member campaign gift to the scholarship fund.

The campaign will run from March 1 through August 31. Members contributing will have their names listed in the Annual Journal which will be published this Fall.


Coulter Recovering
